Charges for extra cost optional items

Incursions

Some students may be given the opportunity to participate in inter-school competitions including swimming, athletics, cross-country running etc. If travel is involved, a \$5.00 contribution may be requested to help cover bus hire costs. If swimming is held at a public pool, entry charges may need to be paid. In 2018 an entry fee to the Aquarena will be \$4.10 for students entering as part of the school group.

Students may be invited to compete in interschool surfing competitions. Entry charges in 2017 were \$20.00. If students choose to compete in additional competitions which are sometimes held simultaneously (but are not part of the school curriculum) eg. Allstars, they may be requested to pay

an additional charge.
