A Guide for Parents

Contributions

In accordance with the *School Education Act 1999* (WA) and School Education Regulations 2000 schools can request a contribution of up to \$60 per student per year in Years K-6 and up to \$235 per student per year in Year 7 to 10.

This contribution is towards the cost of providing an education program that meets the requirements of the Western Australian Curriculum. The contributions collected from parents/guardians are used towards providing materials, services and facilities directly used or consumed by students, including the provision of text materials.

The School Council approves the level of contributions. The costs are detailed on the school contributions and charges list provided.

It is expected that those who can afford to, will make the contribution. Reminders will be sent to all families who have not paid.

Our school offers a range of payment options to assist parents. Please discuss this with the Principal or Manager Corporate Services.

Charges K to 10

Charges apply to high-cost options (called Extra Cost Optional Components) in Years K to 10 that are alternative to parts of the program covered by the contributions. Students can opt to select these.

Extra cost options are also specific activities, services, or facilities that the school offer for students to use or take part in. Excursions such as camps, and other school social activities are examples. Students opt to take part in these activities or use the services or facilities.

The charge associated with the provision of these activities, services or facilities **must be paid**. The charge covers the cost of providing the service or running the activity.

The School Council approves the level of charges. The costs are detailed on the school contributions and charges list.

When bus travel is involved, a charge may apply between \$5 - \$100.

There is a charge of \$250 per term for secondary students attending TAFE Courses in Geraldton.

Charges 11 and 12

Charges apply to all Year 11 and 12 courses and **must be paid**.

School offers a range of payment options to assist parents. Please discuss this with the Principal or Manager Corporate Services.

Education Program Allowance

The West Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- ❖ \$115 Clothing allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian.
- ❖ \$235 Education Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7 – 12 at a secondary school. The parent/guardian must bring the card together with the completed form to the School Office.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- ❖ Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- ❖ Centrelink Family Health Care Card
- ❖ Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

Please note: the only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. The card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid sometime during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own Health Care Card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (eg. Living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Application Forms

Application forms to be completed at the school during Term 1.

Applications close 2 April 2026

Late Applications

Late applications will not be accepted unless the student has recently arrived from interstate or overseas and enrolled after the end of first term.

Contributions and Charges

Schools will receive the Educational Program Allowance for \$235 for approved recipients. In the first instance this amount will be paid directly to the school to reduce elective charges and then applied to voluntary contributions in Years 7-10 and the course charges in Years 11 and 12.

Clothing Allowance

The clothing allowance of \$115 will be paid to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian's bank account.

Processing of Payments

Once the form is completed by the parent/guardian, the school will forward it to the Schools Resourcing and Budgeting Directorate for processing.

Payment Options

All students will be issued with a Voluntary Contributions & Charges Statement by the end of February 2026.

All charges are fully payable by Friday 27 March 2026.

Refund of Contributions and Charges:

Parents will be entitled to a refund of any unused portion of the contributions and charges they have paid if their child transfers to another school prior to the end of the school year. Alternatively, the remaining funds can be transferred to the new school. These refunds will be arranged upon your request and the refund will be based on a rate as approved by the Department of Education.

Year 9-10 Specialist Subjects - Semester 1 & 2

Creative Cooking – Cost: \$50 1 x 80 minutes per week

Creative cooking will allow students to learn skills to prepare and serve a variety of food hygienically and use a variety of kitchen equipment safely. Students will be involved in learning basic chef skills, baking techniques, planning menus, and safe food storage. They will also create interesting meals and explore foods from other cultures they may not have had the opportunity to try. Students will need to bring in their own containers to take their food home.

Woodwork/Metalwork – Cost: \$85 2 x 80 minutes per week

The focus for this unit is production fundamentals. It is an introductory unit for those students who have limited experience in the manufacturing of products. Students apply the fundamentals of design to manufacture products for themselves. They learn to communicate various aspects of the design process within the structure of making their product. Throughout the process, students learn about materials, including their origins, classifications, properties, and suitability for purposes. Students are introduced to relevant technology process skills. Students work in a defined environment and learn to use a variety of relevant technologies safely and effectively.

Jewellery – Cost: \$35 1 x 80 minutes per week

This course will focus on international jewellery styles using beads, wire, macrame, and associated materials to produce jewellery and small decorative projects. Students will design and manufacture their projects using techniques such as beading, wiring, recycling and soldering to name a few.

Visual Arts – No Cost: 2 x 80 minutes per week

Learning in Visual Arts involves students making and responding to artworks, drawing on the world as a source of ideas. Students engage with the knowledge of visual arts, develop skills, techniques, processes, and use materials as they explore a range of forms, styles, and contexts. We will be looking at the works of other artists and studying portrait drawings, landscape painting and still life. The class will focus on the effective use of colour, line, shape, texture, tone, and form. Materials used will include oil, watercolour, and acrylic paints. Drawings will be produced in pencil, charcoal (black and pastel chalk) and ink.

Golf/Bowling - No Cost: 1 x 80 minutes

Learning both golf and lawn bowls offers a unique opportunity to develop precision, patience, and strategy—qualities that resonate across these two distinctly different sports. While both games involve outdoor settings and a focus on accuracy, the skills required, and the mindset needed to excel in each are quite different.

Ceramics - No Cost: 2 x 80 minutes per week

Students will learn the skills and processes of hand-building and using the wheel to create a variety of functional and ornamental works in clay. This hands-on class has an emphasis on the throwing techniques on the potter's wheel, contemporary and traditional hand-building techniques and joining clay forms. Students will be encouraged to think outside the circle and try altering their forms, and surface decoration with slip or glaze decoration. Students will be required to plan, develop, and design their ceramic pieces, construct them to a high standard and finish off with glazing techniques.

Kalbarri Lifestyle D&T - Cost: \$35 1 x 80 minutes per week

The focus for this unit is design and creation of products that are attached to our Kalbarri Lifestyle. It will give the students an opportunity to research local culture and make decisions on practical project-based manufacturing. Students apply the fundamentals of design to manufacture products for themselves. They learn to communicate various aspects of the design process within the structure of making their product. Throughout the process, students learn about materials, including their origins, classifications, properties, and suitability for purposes. Students are introduced to relevant technology process skills. Students work in a defined environment and learn to use a variety of relevant technologies safely and effectively.

Outdoor Ed – Cost: \$50 1 x 80 minutes per week

Students will build confidence and skills in two exciting outdoor pursuits: snorkelling and mountain biking. Throughout the snorkelling unit, students will develop essential water safety awareness, marine environment knowledge, and technical snorkelling techniques through theory and practical sessions. Focus then shifts to mountain biking, where students will learn bike handling, maintenance, and trail-riding skills while exploring local environments responsibly. Students will enhance teamwork, resilience, and environmental stewardship as they engage in challenging and rewarding outdoor experiences.

Students will continue to develop their outdoor skills through bushwalking and water awareness skills. The bushwalking unit focuses on navigation, trip planning, environmental awareness, and minimal-impact practices while exploring local trails and natural settings. In water awareness skills unit, students will build confidence and competence in the water, learning surf safety, basic rescue techniques, and first aid principles. Together, these experiences foster leadership, teamwork, and respect for the natural world, while encouraging students to take active responsibility for their own and others' safety in outdoor environments.

STEM Digital Technologies – Cost: \$35.00 1 x 80 minutes per week Kalbarri DHS is excited to launch a hands-on STEM & Digital Technologies elective. This dynamic course gives students the chance to design, create and problem-solve using industry-standard tools and technology. Students will experiment with 3D printers, a laser cutter/engraver, soldering equipment, and pyro-etching tools to bring their ideas to life. Creativity also comes into focus through iPad-based design and digital photography, allowing students to blend technical skills with artistic expression. This elective is perfect for students who enjoy making, tinkering, and exploring the future of technology.

Bushrangers - No cost: 1x 80mins plus volunteer time outside of school hours.

Bush Rangers WA is a youth-based conservation and community development program that empowers young Western Australians to actively care for the natural environment, gain a deeper understanding of how it is managed, and build their personal leadership through hands-on conservation projects both within the school and across unique locations statewide. As part of the program, Bushrangers also complete the Community Surf Rescue Certificate, developing key skills in aquatic safety, rescue and survival techniques, basic first aid, supervision, and risk awareness. This certificate is recognised under the Department of Education water safety guidelines and ensures students can confidently and safely support others in a range of aquatic environments.

An annual Bushrangers camp is also held (for cost of camp see Yr 7-12 Extra Cost Optional Components for 2026)
